Dear Providers,

On October 1, 2015, the United States transitions from ICD -9 to ICD-10 for billing of medical diagnosis and inpatient hospital procedures. We are writing to remind you that while there is still time to prepare, we are rapidly approaching the October 1 deadline. We ask that beginning October 1, 2015 that your facility provide a valid, numerical, ICD-10 code with <u>all</u> test requests.

Starting on October 1, claims with a date of service on or after October 1, 2015 will only be accepted by the payers, including Medicare, if they contain a valid ICD-10 code. The Medicare claims processing systems will not have the capability to accept ICD-9 codes for dates of service after September 30, 2015, or accept claims that contain both ICD-9 and ICD-10 codes.

This website offers a number of valuable resources including provider training and videos that offer helpful ICD-10 implementation tips. Your individual EMR systems may also have tools to provide a crosswalk to convert ICD-9 to ICD-10. Please contact your provider for this information.

We would like to direct you to a look up tool provided online by CMS. This tool will allow you to enter the diagnosis and search for the appropriate ICD-10 diagnosis code.
